



Generations Scholarship Programme

Which Students Can Apply For This Programme?

This programme is for Level 3 students who have attained 10 GCSEs at grades A-A*/7-9 including Maths and English. These students will have also had excellent attendance, punctuality and attitude to learning at KS4, as demonstrated by references and data – specific criteria will apply.¹

What Is the Main Focus Of the Programme?

Given their high prior attainment, students on the programme are expected to succeed on an academically focused Level 3 pathway. The programme is designed to provide students with both challenge and support with achieving the top grades at A Level, and to equip them with the skills and qualifications needed to progress to top universities or prestigious apprenticeships.

The programme provides:

- £200 grant to spend on specific education-related resources, as agreed by the Sixth Form – conditions apply²
- Allocation to the 'Oxbridge / Medics and Russell Group Universities' or 'University & Higher Education' pathway
- Teaching for the Cambridge Pre U qualification, Medical entrance examinations, or support for an application to a prestigious apprenticeship
- An academic mentor or business mentor
- Support to apply for a prestigious university summer school or high-end summer internship/work experience
- Access to the vast array of personalised support and guidance available to all members of Goffs Sixth Form

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¹Criteria that will be applied to determine whether students are eligible for the Scholarship Programme

Outcomes/Courses

- Students will have attained 10 GCSE grades at A-A* or Grade 7 to 9, which must include Mathematics and English

Attendance/Punctuality

- Attendance for Year 11 will be at 95% or higher, unless there are specific extenuating circumstances evidenced by medical paperwork
- Students will have received no late marks during Year 11, other than in exceptional circumstances.

Attitude to Learning

- Students will not have been on behaviour report during Year 11
- Students will not have received C3 sanctions or equivalent during Year 11

For external students, the above will be evidenced via a reference on headed paper from their previous school

²Conditions applying to expenditure of the £200 grant

Students will have the opportunity to spend their grant on educational materials or resources that will directly support their studies. These may include:

- Additional text books or revision guides
- Funds towards a work laptop or tablet
- Educational software
- Academic Summer School/Courses
- University taster courses
- Private tuition with a registered teacher/tutor
- School trips
- Subscriptions to educational journals, magazines
- Subscription to reliable/reputable online revision websites
- Educational conferences/lectures
- Travel expenses for University open days
- Specific equipment/resources required A Level courses e.g. graphical calculator
- Downloads related to A Level Subjects e.g. e-books, podcasts, etc.



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Students will not have the opportunity to spend their grant on items such as:

- A new mobile phone
- Clothes or accessories
- School meals i.e. Chartwell
- Downloads unrelated to A Level Subjects

Students will complete the request form below to request their spend, at any point during their Year 12 academic year, prior to the Summer Half Term. All applications will be reviewed by the Associate Assistant Principal, Sixth Form as well as the Principal, and the right is reserved to refuse or accept requests as is deemed appropriate by the Trust. Payments will not be made retrospectively for purchases.

Payments will be made by cheque or bank transfer.
